Open 1-4 Sun, Wed & Sat. Closed Nov-Feb and Holidays. Admission \$2 for adults, \$1 for children. The museum preserves the heritage of the Stillaguamish River Valley with logging and sawmill displays, a model railroad, animal mounts & more. Pioneer Park surrounds the park with three ponds, home to wildlife.

Downtown Arlington

- ◆ Park your car for free in one of two large parking lots or anywhere on the streets and take a stroll down our charming main street, Olympic Ave.



- ◆ Shop for antiques, collectibles, crafts, gifts, home decor, clothing, pet supplies, quilting materials, sporting goods, gardening supplies, hardware and much more...

- ◆ Shop for fresh produce at the Arlington Farmers Market at Legion Park on Saturdays June-Sept.

- ◆ Walk around the historic residential district.

- ◆ Dine at one of the several cafes and restaurants for breakfast, lunch or dinner: American, Mexican, Thai and upscale Northwest cuisine.



- ◆ Enjoy the art and flowers at City Hall.

- ◆ Stop at the Veterans Memorial in Legion Park to read the names of Arlington residents who have served in military services.

- ◆ Note the humor of Arlington's Centennial Time Capsule celebrating history with a tree trunk and milk can.

- ◆ Walk, bike, or skate the Centennial Trail through downtown and beyond, from the Stillaguamish River all the way to Lake Stevens & Snohomish to the south. And soon to the north to Skagit County.



- ◆ Glide through the air, learn to pilot at Arlington Airport.

- ◆ Swing under the trees in Terrace Park & at the edge of the river at Haller Park.



- ◆ Watch for the sculptures and murals along the Centennial Trail and around town, and visit the fountain in Centennial Park on Division Street.

- ◆ Walk across the river to Twin Rivers Park to explore the confluence of the two forks of the Stillaguamish River where the modern history of Arlington began more than 140 years ago.

- ◆ Watch for critters at the Portage Creek Wildlife area. 59th Ave off of Hwy 530.

- ◆ Climb Zimmerman Hill, with more than 200 steps and 2000 feet through natural habitat at the north end of Crown Ridge Blvd.

- ◆ Fish on the Stilly, or in Lake McMurray, Lake Riley or Twin Lakes.

- ◆ Visit area farms, nurseries and tree farms depending on the season.

- ◆ Bike or ride horses in the Pilchuck Tree Farm north of town.

- ◆ Watch a play or concert at Performing Arts Center.

- ◆ Walk the Whitehorse Trail.
